Schedule

The show airs every Thursday night from 8:00 - 10:00 pm during the regular James Madison University school year. The show moves to 9:00 pm during exam weeks, and does not air during University holidays. Exact dates/times can be found on the Show Schedule page on our website.

Performer load-in begins at 7:00 pm, and you should be ready for sound check by 7:45 pm. Please contact us to make special arrangements if you need to arrive earlier or later. On the day of the show, please let us know if you are running late.

Format

The show is divided into two hour-long segments. For larger groups, and those with lots of material, we will feature the same act in both segments. Otherwise, we will split the show between two acts, with one hour-long segment for each act. We take a 10-15 minute break in the middle of the show.

There is time for approximately 30-40 minutes of music per segment. The remainder of the time is used for intros, station IDs, weather, our Live Music Update, performer promotion/interview, and relaying listener comments and shout-outs.

During your segment(s), you will play "mini-sets" of 2-4 songs each. The show staff will take short voice breaks between these mini-sets, so that listeners know the name of the band and how to participate, and for other show elements as noted above.

Equipment / Space

You need to bring your stage gear, including instruments, amps, and cables. If you have a favored vocal mic or other special equipment, feel free to bring it along. We can provide most everything else: direct boxes, some monitor gear, vocal mics, instrument & drum mics, mic stands, XLR cables, etc.

You will have your own studio during the show, with plenty of space for a full drum set and up to 7 or 8 band members. Bring along a few friends to join you in the studio, or keep the room clear of distractions — it's up to you. The sound engineer will mix and co-host the show from a small satellite studio, separated by glass. (Let us know if you want to bring your own sound engineer.)

Promotion

Make sure to tell friends, family, and fans about the show, and post show details on your website or MySpace. Include contact information for the show (see above), and ask them to call or IM us while we are on the air. (We don't put callers on live, but we will pass along messages.)

Remember to include information about how to tune in (see below), for your fans who may be unfamiliar with WXJM.

Broadcast / Webcast

WXJM broadcasts via a 390W FM transmitter, on a frequency of 88.7 MHz. Reception is generally good within 15-20 miles of Harrisonburg, Virginia, depending on antenna and receiver quality.

For fans who are out of the Harrisonburg area, the station maintains a live streaming webcast, using a SHOUTcast server. A link to the webcast is available on our website.
